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THE FUTURE CAPITOL MEDICAL CENTER

Capitol Medical Center, Inc. - a Mount Grace Partner, is set to embark on a major expansion project in its bid to become one of the Philippines' top hospitals. Drawings are underway for a proposed master plan to be carried out in three phases. This includes the construction of three new buildings including brand-new comprehensive, state-of-the-art Oncology Center. The CMC Colleges will also be transferred back to the area from its current location along Quezon Avenue.

The current buildings will be temporarily renovated before they are replaced by new modern buildings equipped with advanced technological equipment.



Slated to open this year are the Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy (HBOT) and Wound Care Center and the Vitality Center for Nutrition, Sleep Health and Metabolism. The Non-Invasive Cardiovascular Laboratory will transfer back to its newly-renovated location at the 2nd Floor while the Pulmonary Laboratory will be relocated beside the Main Laboratory also at the 2nd Floor.

All of these improvements will be complemented by the construction of a new multi-level parking building to accommodate the growing clientele.

BEYOND WELLNESS, VITALITY

Thinking of going on a “Keto Diet”? Wondering why you sleep 7 hours and still wake up unrefreshed? Or why you sometimes have cravings for salty and high-carb food at night? Do you have difficulty controlling your blood pressure in spite of multiple drugs? Do you need to learn how to measure blood sugar or inject insulin for a relative? These are just a few of the problems that the Vitality Center can help you or your patients with.

Oftentimes patients (and maybe even some physicians) don’t recognize the interrelatedness of the different pillars of health, leading to fragmented care. Capitol Medical Center is proud to open first center in the Philippines to evaluate and treat sleep, nutrition and metabolism disorders in one unit called the Vitality Center for Nutrition, Sleep Health and Metabolism for better patient-centered care.

Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA), a common sleep disorder causing excessive daytime sleepiness (“masandal tulog”), for example, alters the hormones that signal fullness after a meal thus may lead to obesity. By itself OSA has already been proven to be a risk factor for high blood pressure, stroke, heart attack, atrial fibrillation and diabetes mellitus. In addition, the resulting obesity also becomes a risk factor for many metabolic diseases like lipid disorders and again, diabetes mellitus. Diabetes causes kidney and nerve problems leading to Restless Legs Syndrome which leads to difficulty sleeping at night (insomnia). The burden of chronic diseases can also cause Anxiety and Depression (also often missed in the elderly), which are the very common causes for insomnia. See the vicious cycle and how proper nutrition and sleep interventions fit in now?

The Vitality Center is a multi-specialty facility staffed with nutritionists, respiratory therapists, nurse educators, psychologists and doctors. Dr. Quintin Babaran, a gastroenterologist, heads the team which is composed of endocrinologists (Dr. Honolina Gomez and Mary Anne Lim-Abrahan), diabetologist Dr. Rima Tan and sleep specialists Drs. Romulus Instrella (otorhinolarygologist), Deborah Bernardo (neurologist) and Mander Cambonga, (pulmonologist). They serve both out- and in-patient referrals. In addition, the Nutrition Team evaluates all patients upon admission to the hospital and suggest intervention as necessary, like in pre-operative cases. It is located at the Lower Ground floor near the Admission Office and Skin Center. For inquiries call 372-3825 local 1203.



PhilHealth CABG-Z Package Benefit Available in Capitol Soon!

Cognizant of the medical needs of the Filipino as well as the rising cost of health care, the Capitol Medical Center has time and again offered affordable surgical packages to its patients. Since the inception of cardiac surgery in 2014, CORONARY ARTERY BYPASS GRAFT (CABG) surgery has followed suit and has been offered, at a reasonable price, to patients needing surgical treatment of their ischemic heart disease. However, despite all efforts, the cost of CABG surgery has remained to be prohibitive and a financial risk to the Filipino who needs such treatment.

It is for this reason that Capitol Medical Center has embarked on a Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) accreditation process to be a health care provider of Z-Benefit CABG package. Under the Z-Benefit CABG package, an eligible patient may avail of a PhilHealth-backed financial assistance worth PhP550,000.00 for payment of his CABG surgery and other expenses incurred during confinement. Without much delay, it can be said that the accreditation process has started with a visit from the PhilHealth accreditation team last April 30, 2019; led by Dr. Coracel Ontalan, Medical Specialist III and ably assisted by the following: Dr. Zenaida Agustin, Medical Specialist III, Dr. Evelyn Lopez, Medical Specialist III, and Miss Melissa Mamaril, Social Insurance Officer.

In line with these developments, additional surgical, medical and nursing staff has been added to complement the newly renovated Thoracic and Cardiovascular Surgery Operating Room Complex and Post-Anesthesia/ Coronary Care Unit, located at the 3rd floor.

IS YOUR WATER SAFE?

The Department of Health (DOH) today advised those who are experiencing water shortage to make sure that their drinking water is safe to avoid illnesses.

"It is important to ensure the quality of your drinking water through simple, inexpensive steps to treat and safely store water in your homes to avoid falling ill," Health Secretary Francisco Duque III declared.

DOH authorities said that drinking water from unsafe sources can be made safe for drinking by boiling or by using chlorine tablets. Bring water to a boil and allow it to boil for two (2) minutes to kill disease-causing organisms. Chlorinating water for drinking is an alternative way to make it safe but it may not be effective against some disease-causing organisms, such as those that cause watery diarrhea.

"In the midst of the water shortage crisis, continue observing personal hygiene to avoid common diseases such as scabies, diarrhea and other food and waterborne diseases," Secretary Duque also said, adding that the limited amount of water may tempt many to forego personal hygiene habits such as taking a bath and frequent washing of hands.

Let us conserve water, adapt to the limited water supply and make sure to prioritize cleanliness and personal health at all times," the health chief advised.
