On October 11, 2022, on what would have been my grandmother's 101st birthday, two significant events occurred: the blessing of the brand new CMC Colleges building along Quezon Avenue and the opening of the new Legacy Wall (in the walkway between CMC IV and MAB).

It was definitely a day of celebration, a joyful reminder that the worst of the pandemic was finally behind us and a signal that we could collectively move forward into a very promising future.

That a new building for the CMC Colleges (housing our Nursing, Rad Tech and Med Tech courses) was actually built during the pandemic is a testament to the resiliency of CMC as an institution, as well as the strength of the commitment of the CMC/Mount Grace partnership.

What started as one woman's dream continues to grow 53 years later. It began with a grand vision of putting up a Tertiary hospital in Quezon City. Dra. Thelma was someone who always got things done, and with the help of investors who believed in her goal (mostly relatives and friends), she gradually brought this aspiration to life. She and my grandfather Papa Luis bought the first lot CMC is standing on and mortgaged their own house as collateral for a loan to build the original building.

Everyone who has encountered Dra. Clemente marvels at her energy. She was a trailblazer, a woman who never sprouted feminist jargon yet was comfortable working and achieving in maledominated fields. Her 30-page resume is a testament to her work ethic- Founder, Chairman and President of Capitol Medical Center, 12-term President of the Philippine Hospital Association and first woman President of the Asian Hospital Federation. Her numerous awards (as seen in the Legacy Wall) pay tribute to her dedication and commitment to her professional endeavors.

Her formula for success relied heavily on hard work. She never retired- even at 95 years old she continued to be actively involved in the management of her beloved CMC. She had a genuine passion for her



vocation, a singleminded determination to pursue her goals, and the discipline and commitment to make the difficult daily choices to achieve those objectives.

Through the pandemic years, as Capitol Medical Center and the CMC family faced the challenges the lockdowns entailed, I remembered my grandmother as I walked through the quiet halls of the hospital. I recalled her stories of the war years in PGH, where as a medical student she lived on campus and tended wounded soldiers in the ER, suffered the shortages of food and supplies, and faced the numerous dangers war entailed. Her courage lifted me up and carried me through the rigors of the pandemic. The Legacy Wall is a daily reminder of her faith in the face of adversity, and proof that we too, can overcome Life's obstacles with God's help.

Dra. Thelma was always aware of her own mortality, always conscious of her legacy. She lived a full life



and achieved success without compromising her values. She fulfilled God's purpose and plan, and was a good steward who bore much fruit.

From where I stand I see her clearly-- who she was, what she stood for, and what she sacrificed to get there. She was an extraordinary woman who has lived an extraordinary life and like all of you who have known her, I am grateful and blessed to have spent time with her.

In 2023 Dra. Clemente's legacy continues to grow. As part of the Mount Grace group of hospitals, Capitol Medical Center is in a good position to face the numerous challenges ahead. Her legacy also lives on in the lives she touched- the many doctors, hospital and administrative staff who remember her and her accomplishments, as well as the many people who admired and loved her. We are all better people for having known her. Though it has been 6 years since the mighty eagle has flown home, I know that she still keeps watch over beloved CMC and the people who work there. Walking past the Legacy Wall is a daily reminder of how God can use our lives and our "time, talent and treasure" as instruments of His will.

# **Becoming a Critical Care Nurse...**

My journey toward becoming a critical care nurse has been nothing short of challenging, inspiring, and gratifying. Becoming a critical care nurse is not for the faint of heart; it requires dedication, unwavering commitment, and an unquenchable thirst for knowledge and improvement.

When I embarked on this journey to be trained at the Philippine Heart Center, it took me a while to decide because I knew that the road ahead would be challenging, given the degree of pressure that I, along with Giselle and Justice, must bear to represent the entire institution. Adding to this is its exemplary record of former nurses who completed the course with flying colors. However, I agreed, not because I aspire to be one of the nurses who will excel but because I want to make a difference in the lives of my critically ill patients. Moreover, I decided to seize this once-in-a-lifetime nursing career opportunity. I am confident it will open doors for professional growth and will enable me to become a bearer of knowledge. I have envisioned every nurse, especially novice, to be globally competent, proficient, and trustworthy.

Yet, little did I know that this simple vision for myself and the nursing community inspired me to aim for greater heights. Out of the 45 participants from all over the Philippines, I never imagined being on the list of top-performing nursing trainees. My only desire was to complete countless complex tasks throughout the course. In this case, I cannot provide a concise, direct response to questions about how I earned such recognition, but I can walk you through how I handled this nerve-wracking experience I thrust myself into.

**Systematic:** Being provided with a timetable for the entire six-week training program was beneficial. This framework served as my guide in helping me prioritize specific activities at particular times, especially when preparing for exams. I believed this skill was shared by many nurses. When caring for patients, we set goals and perform activities based on their immediate needs.

**Self-Discipline:** Although I rarely procrastinate, one effective way to stay on track is to question my intentions, why I want to achieve something, and my purpose for pursuing a goal. These questions helped me stay focused, motivated, and consistent in my learning efforts.

**Passion:** My enthusiasm for my profession is one of the character traits I am proud to possess. Passion significantly impact the quality and success of your efforts. When you are passionate about your work, you will become more motivated and driven to excel. Your enthusiasm and commitment push you to go extra mile, invest effort, and view challenges as opportunity to learn and grow, rather looking it as insurmountable roadblocks.

**Rest:** For someone who consistently puts so much effort, finding time to rest or knowing when to take a break is essential. Remember that rest is not a hindrance to productivity but vital for achieving success. As I firmly experienced during my six-week training course, getting sufficient rest helped me function effectively and efficiently during hospital exposure, think critically, and absorb essential information during discussions.

**Mentorship and Networking:** Throughout the program, I sought mentorship from experts in the critical care field, learning the best practices from their experiences in the ICU setting. In addition, initiating connections opened up opportunities to meet new people and improve my interpersonal skills. The guidance from these individuals helped me navigate challenges and make informed decisions, especially during life-and-death situations.

These transformative weeks of training to become a top 2 critical care nurse were marked by a tireless pursuit of excellence, continuous learning, and unwavering dedication to patient care. I am deeply grateful for the unwavering support of my supervisor, IMD managers, colleagues, and, most importantly, the patients who entrusted me with their lives. As I continue on this incredible journey, I am committed to pushing the boundaries of what is possible in critical care nursing and making a lasting impact in the lives of those in need.



# CMC's Cardiac Team and Japanese Specialist Collaborate on Chronic Total Occlusion

Significant coronary artery disease is a problem worldwide which affects all people in every country. There are simple coronary occlusions and there are complete coronary occlusions like chronic total occlusion. Chronic Total Occlusion is a complicated and challenging procedure in the field of interventional cardiology. CTO is the complete blockage of the coronary arteries which can lead to several cardiac adverse consequences. This common and significant condition is affecting several patients worldwide affecting their everyday lives. Performing complex lesions like CTOs entails training, talent and experience. Last October 5, 2023, Terumo sponsored a workshop in performing a CTO lesion in a patient of this institution. The team was led by Dr. Yoshiaki Ito and was assisted by Dr. Ramoncito Tria and Dr. Mark Gavin Garcia. Dr. Ito is currently the Director of the Cardiovascular Center of the Saiseikai Yokohamashi Tobu Hospital in Japan. He specializes in emergent cardiology, intravascular imaging and coronary interventions including CTO lesions. Dr. Mon Tria is an active consultant in Capitol Medical Center and Chairman of the Department of Medicine. He is also the Head of the Invasive Laboratory in Philippine Heart Center. Dr. Gavin Garcia is one of the upcoming Interventional Cardiologist in the institution and also an active consultant in Capitol Medical Center. Intraprocedurely, there was difficulty in cannulating the lesion but thankfully due to the skill full hands of Dr. Ito the wire went through and they have



proceeded in opening up the artery. The operators successfully crossed and stented the CTO in the right coronary artery where the procedure lasted for almost 8 hours. The patient tolerated the procedure well and was sent home after 3 days. Performing a successful intervention on a CTO lesion can potentially improve the quality of life and provide better long-term outcomes for patients with significant coronary artery disease. Not all operators are capable of performing such complicated procedures. It must be remembered that practice and experience are still the best teachers to make seemingly complicated procedures to be a simple one. Life provides the opportunity for every individual to be more and to live more.
